

The number of new cases of mouth cancer has been increasing each year since 2002



Early diagnosis is key to improve survival

Actions for healthboards and health professionals:



Improve public and healthcare professional awareness of mouth cancer



Advise people to see a dentist for regular check-ups even if they do not have any teeth



Provide effective brief interventions to people at risk



Ensure an urgent mouth cancer referral pathway exists



1st November to 30th November

90% of mouth cancers are linked to lifestyle factors



Drink less alcohol





Quit smoking or chewing tobacco



Practice safe sex to reduce risk of HPV



Maintain a healthy diet



Check your mouth monthly
