

Changing from Edoxaban to **Apixaban**

A SMALL CHANGE THAT HELPS THE NHS WHILE KEEPING YOUR CARE SAFE AND **EFFECTIVE**

Why are we asking you to consider a change?

You are currently taking Edoxaban to help reduce the risk of stroke linked to atrial fibrillation.

Recently, another medicine called Apixaban which works in the same way — has become much cheaper for the NHS. This is because its patent has expired, allowing other companies to produce the same medicine at a lower cost. Both medicines are equally effective and safe. The only difference is that Apixaban now costs much less.



Same protection, smarter choice **Apixaban saves the NHS around** £47 every month per patient.

Switching across Powys could save around £750,000 a year — money that can be reinvested into local care, services, and treatments that support people in our community.



How will the change happen?

SWITCHING IS SIMPLE:

- Finish your remaining Edoxaban tablets as usual
- Start your new medicine the very next day

Your new medicine: Apixaban

- Taken twice a day, about 12 hours apart
- Can be taken with or without food
- Has a slightly lower risk of major bleeding compared with some other options
- If you usually crush your tablets, you can do the same with Apixaban

Alternative option: Rivaroxaban

- Taken once a day, but must be taken with a full meal
- Missing food can make it less effective
- Has a slightly higher risk of bleeding than Apixaban

What do you need to do?
